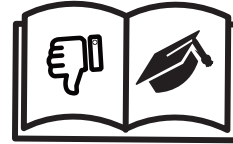


Scenario 1:

A friend asks to look at your reflective journal “for ideas” in a subject you’ve already completed. What do you do?

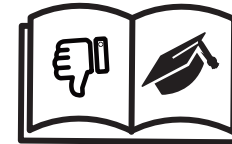
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 2:

The upcoming assignment is a speech and you and a friend are having a tough time writing what to say. You have different tutors and your friend suggests writing one speech together and both using it. What do you do?

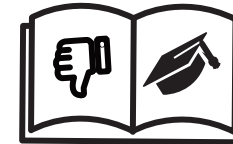
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 3:

You are experiencing difficulty with your assignment and feel stuck. What do you do?

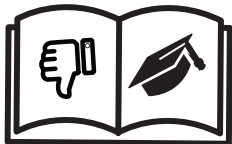
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 4:

You’ve completed the research and writing for an assignment for a subject, but you’re not sure whether your use of English is correct for the style of assignment. What do you do?

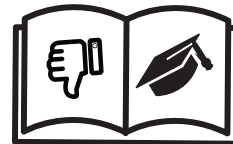
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 5:

A friend offers you the questions and answers from the final exam of a subject you are enrolled in this semester. What do you do?

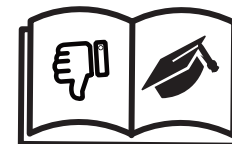
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 6:

You have an in-class quiz that is open book and open electronic device. A friend in another tutorial class asks you to be in an online chat group during the quiz so that you can share questions and answers. What do you do?

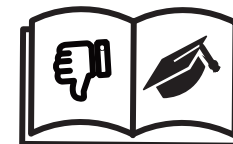
Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



Scenario 7:

Part way through your clinical placement, you realise you haven’t been taking adequate notes. These will form part of your assessment and are supposed to help you prepare a reflective journal. What do you do?

Discuss with the group how you could respond to this scenario, then spin the wheel.



ANSWER



Pay an editing and grammar service to professionally edit your assignment. They re-write portions of your assignment so that it makes more sense. The assignment marker notices that the language in your assignment is different to other pieces of writing and you are found guilty of misconduct.



You approach the HELPS staff and they show you how to use Grammarly to review and edit your own assignment. You improve your English language skills and this helps you in future assignments.

ANSWER



Your friend gives you the name of an assignment assistance service that helped them with the same assignment last term and you pay for them to draft the assignment. What you don't know is that the assignment service has given the same assignment to another student and you both get charged with misconduct and receive 0.



You approach your lecturer, tutor for assistance. They may help you directly and/or put you in touch with the UTS Library research desk.

ANSWER



You and your friend write a speech and change a few words between them to suit your style. As they were videoed and reviewed your teacher noticed the content was exactly the same and you received a 0 on this assignment.



You write your own speeches and organise a study session where you practice and give each other feedback based on the marking guide. You then go home and revise your speech based on the feedback received.

ANSWER



You give them a copy of your journal, two weeks later your friend is charged with cheating and plagiarism. The university also lodges charges against you and this will result in you now failing that subject.



You appreciate that they might need some help however rather than giving them your work which risks them plagiarising off you, you offer to review the resources and guides you used to write your reflective journal.

ANSWER



You fabricate some additional comments about each of your clients based on some material found online. Your marker randomly calls one of your clients and discovers your lies. You receive 0 and when you apply for professional registration, they question your ethics.



You approach your subject coordinator for advice on what to do. They send you some resources on how to take better client notes and suggest being honest about this in your reflective journal. You pass the assessment.

ANSWER



Accept the chat request and share the questions and answers. When your tutor randomly asks you to stand up and explain the answer to a question your friend gave you the answer to, you receive 0 for that part of the assessment.



You decline the request, telling your friend that it is better they work through the quiz alone so that they can learn all of the content for the course. You offer to chat with your friend about the quiz after to learn where you both made mistakes and clarify your understanding.

ANSWER



Accept the materials, memorise the answers and use them in your final exam. The subject coordinator changes the questions and you get very few marks. It is not enough to pass and you have to re-sit the subject



Refuse the materials and follow your coordinator's guidance on how to prepare for the exam.
